<u>Lead Pastor Ministry Report – Pastor Tom Greentree</u>

We, the Erickson Covenant Church, are committed to helping people **find** and **follow** Jesus. *And why?* So that everyone can **flourish** in Christ and **fulfill** his mission in the world. *And how does that happen?* As we, his people, are being spiritually **formed** as disciples of Jesus (and yes, that's all part of following, flourishing, and fulfilling!).

2023 was a good year for us as a community, and I hope you've been able to read all the encouraging ministry summaries in this Annual Report with a deep sense of gratitude. God is up to something good among us. For 2023, I've focused much of my ministry through the lens of spiritual formation: how am I supporting, encouraging, and fostering our spiritual formation and the spiritual formation of others? With that focus, let me summarize my year as follows:

First, I supported our spiritual formation by supporting others leading in ministry. A big part of my ministry role here at ECC is to encourage and empower other ministry leaders, both volunteer and staff. This past year, I have walked alongside many of our ministers, providing guidance and help where I am able. For example, I regularly meet with Bonny and Brendan to support them as they lead our children and youth ministry; I've also been very involved in the design and execution of our Kids Sundays. I support Eileen and share some of the administration load, as needed (Bonny also has been helping there). I meet with the worship leaders, as well as sharing in some of the music leading on Sunday mornings. I am part of the Connect Groups team, led by Peter Hambrey, which is fostering this most critical ministry for our spiritual formation. I meet with various other ministry leaders as needed, such as the Covenant Mission Partners, Dream Team, Willing Hands, and Maintenance, again as needed and in the hopes to release them to lead as called. I am part of the budget and nominations committees. And of course I'm on the ECC Leadership Team, who is tasked with overseeing it all and leading us forward--I'm so grateful for our LT. And there are others, but this gives you a sense of how I focus a lot of my time and energy in the support of those who are leading others and who are doing the work of ministry among us.

Second, I encouraged our spiritual formation by providing people with pastoral care and spiritual counsel. Within healthy boundaries, I am available to meet with anyone who asks. And I do. By God's grace, I have been able to help people struggling through personal and family difficulties, spiritual questions, broken friendships, life changes, and traumatic events. While I do at times refer people to others more suited to help, I am often in the best position to provide what is needed. I been called to the hospital by doctors and nurses numerous times this year, to care for people who do not have a church or faith connection. I also meet with some of our Covenanters for more intentional mentoring and support, and I meet with interested people who want to know more about who we are as a church, what we believe and care about, and whether or not they could be a part of the Erickson Covenant Church.

Third, I fostered our spiritual formation through the preaching and teaching of Scripture.

In 2023, we took a deep dive into the Gospel of Luke, using the metaphor of "apprenticeship" and approaching the gospel as a kind of "Masterclass" in the way of Jesus. Of the 52 Sundays in 2023, 31 of them were Masterclass Sundays, and the responses have been very good. These teaching sessions have motivated many to follow Jesus more faithfully and be spiritually formed under his leadership. Other than the four Kids Sundays and a some special days (like Easter and New Years Eve), the two other teaching series in 2023 were a meaningful summer in the Psalms (10 weeks) and the wonderful Advent season (4 weeks) we just enjoyed. God's Word is central to our spiritual formation, as we let the word of Christ dwell richly in us (Col. 3:16). This is of course happening as we personally read, pray, and study Scripture, and we are always urging and teaching about the importance of personal habits for spiritual formation. But, very significantly, much of how we let the Word of Christ dwells in us happens as we gather corporately to worship God, serve one another, and learn from Scripture, and then amplifies again many times when we gather corporately in smaller Connect Groups to pray and discuss how the Spirit is forming us further.

One important 2023 development was the creation of a more formalized ECC preaching team, consisting of Peter Hambrey, Cheryl Hambrey, Valerie Comer, and myself. I know you have all been blessed by them as they have taught us at various times last year. We meet as a preaching team once a month to pray, discuss, and prepare for the upcoming messages. I am grateful to these three and their willingness to serve us in this capacity (on top of other ministries they are involved in). We were also blessed by other gifted preachers this last year, such as Rob Peterson, Mark Hagen and our very own Terry Young.

As your pastor, I continue to give thanks to God for you. This is my 13th year as the pastor of ECC, and I count it a privilege to serve you as we are all being formed in Christ and fulfilling his mission together. May Jesus continue to lead us forward, unifying us by his Spirit and deepening us in his love, for the glory of the Father and for the good of his world.

Leadership Team Ministry Report – Jo-Ann Ewing

I was given the privilege to join the Leadership Team last year, the team by faith offered me the chair position. This is a new area of ministry and leadership for me, one I am honoured to hold. It has been a year of learning and leaning. Learning what it means to be the "chair" of the Leadership Team and leaning on the guidance of the Holy Spirit that I may accomplish these duties in accordance with God's will.

Your Leadership Team is called to the management, administration and oversight of business and spiritual affairs of Erickson Covenant Church, a tall order.

Your Leadership Team and staff started the year with a team building retreat at the Harbour in Riondel, in March, with a main focus on prayer for our whole church community.

Monthly meetings are held, in order to stay on top of past, present and future concerns in all areas of ministry and church life. We encourage everyone to reach out with any concerns or issues you would like the Leadership Team to discuss. Minutes of all meetings are available for your review in the Minute Books maintained by the Administrative Staff.

We maintain a close working relationship with our treasurer, who prepares monthly financial snapshots and brings any concerns to our attention.

Noticeable changes: This year, we began hosting our morning worship services as Leadership Team members. Our plan is to put a face to the Leadership Team names so each and everyone of you know who your Leadership Team members are.

<u>Our main focus this year:</u> The "third leg" of the ministry stool. The first leg being our Sunday morning gathering times for service, worship and spiritual formation. Our second leg, small Connect Groups for growing friendships and further spiritual formation, (started up this past fall). Our third leg, the missional action leg, was presented at our November congregational meeting, which was the potential of running a Christian day care in our building. We received overwhelmingly positive support to move forward with this idea. We are still looking for a person or persons who would be willing to do the initial leg work of emails and phone calls with the proper authorities to put an action plan in place.

One of the duties of the Leadership Team is setting goals for the upcoming year. During this first year on the team I discovered a few areas in need of improvement.

We have many areas of ministry and I'm embarrassed to say I was not aware of them all, or the many people involved in them.

Goal: Tabulate the active ministries and persons involved with them.

Another area in need of improvement brought to our attention was the care of our pastor and ministry staff.

Goal: Reactivate the Pastoral relations committee.

An area, I personally would like to focus on is a "check in" with leaders of each ministry team. I truly believe the body functions with greater effect when we know who and what each other is doing.

There are many areas the Leadership Team focuses, prayers, discerns and discusses on a regular basis. I have not included all of them in this report as many are being presented in other reports. Rest assured that we work closely with the budget and nomination committees.

This has been a year of growth for me. I appreciate the church's faith in me to stand in this role. Please know, I faithfully pray for our community, and God's guidance.

<u>Treasurer's Report – Dayle Wiens</u>

Financial Stewardship: In the 2023 fiscal year at Erickson Covenant Church, our community demonstrated unwavering commitment despite a budget of \$210,000 and an income of \$198,477.24.

In the fall of 2023 we once again saw the faithful generosity of our congregation as they supported the Ecuador Missions Project, reflecting the heart of our congregation to extend our reach beyond our local boundaries raising \$5955 towards this project.

With an overall expenditure of \$203,000, we maintained responsible financial management while ensuring every dollar was a testament to our mission and values. Furthermore, a significant stride was made towards our ECC Loan. The leadership team and congregation approved a one time payment in early 2023 of \$10,000 from our existing bank balance, significantly reducing our balance owing.

Biblical Inspiration: Proverbs 11:25 reminds us of the essence of our giving: "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed." This verse encapsulates the spirit of our congregation emphasizing that our generosity and selflessness not only benefit others but also bring abundance and spiritual fulfillment to ourselves. As we stand united in purpose, each act of giving, whether in finance or service, is a seed planted for a bountiful harvest, enriching both the giver and the receiver,

Gratitude and Vision: I'd like to extend a heartfelt gratitude to our congregation for your steadfast support and sacrificial giving. Your commitment has not only sustained our operations but also allowed us to further our mission and impact both locally and globally. Media Ministries Report – Dan Mawson

It's been a good year in the Technical Ministries at ECC, one of growth and transition. We have been blessed with several new people joining our team, sharing the ministry demands and building our community. This fall has also seen a leadership transition, with Olin taking the lead on Sunday technical demands when I moved to the coast in November. I remain involved with a part-time contract to manage media off-line (video editing, website and graphics). We have had several team meetings throughout the year to facilitate training of new members and building into our team.

Here are a few highlights in each area:

Sound:

- Cheryl Hambrey has joined the sound team in a regular rotation
- We added additional microphone stands, cables and 2 choir microphones this year
- purchased a new Bass Amp to replace a loaner
- Thank you to our team of Olin, Jack & Cheryl

Lighting:

- Upgraded our main stage lighting to brighter, more reliable fixtures
- We had a training night dedicated to the lighting system in October

ProPresenter:

• Slides and video are an integral part of our services for worship and messages. ProPresenter is a software package that drives all our visuals on the in-house projection screen and to Church Online. Thank you to the team of Cameron, Jack, Eileen and Olin for directing that content.

Video:

- The video team has done a tremendous job supporting the Church Online ministry, allow many to engage with our services who could not attend in person. Each Sunday we have a camera operator and a video switcher/director on board to broadcast our services. Our services are broadcast live via the Church Online platform. Video content from our services is then edited and uploaded weekly to our website. All our services are also archived and available on our website. Messages are available on our YouTube Channel and on Apple Podcasts.

Church Online:

• In 2023 we had a total of 753 views (screens) representing approximately 1200 guests attending our services online. That's an average of 100 views per month, guests that are considered part of our church but unable to be with us in person. Weekly numbers range from 10-30 screens. We don't know specifically where they are attending from, but I suspect it's a combination of both local, regional and guests from a far.

Website:

• Our website continues to be ministry hub, sharing information, links and audio and video versions our services. We receive an average of 400 visits to our site each month.

YouTube:

• Full services are available on our website whereas our weekly messages are published on YouTube. These messages are viewed on average of 12 times over several months. Views will vary depending on the popularity of a series. Val Comer seems to have an online following and draws more views than average.

Graphics:

• I work with Tom to create unique graphics for our Sunday services and message series. These graphics are used for slides in the service, service videos, Church Online, website and emails.

Emails:

• Weekly emails are composed and designed and sent out to 175 email addresses. This email gives us a weekly connection to our members and followers sharing current information and promoting our services, message series and events. Thanks to Eileen and Tom for religiously getting these sent out (pun intended).

It's amazing!

This fall, Amanda worked hard to form a regular monthly choir. Although it was small, they sounded beautiful, and it was great to see some different faces involved. Amanda is planning to form a special Easter choir and we look forward to that.

As we move into the new year, we are hoping and praying that God will inspire more worship leaders and we can help raise them up. We would also like to see more kids' participating though singing up front and/or leading actions and participating in kids' Sundays.

Please pray that God will continue to strengthen our worship leaders and raise up more to be involved.

For the last couple years, Jan Gobert ably lead our Dream Team Hospitality Ministry. This past fall, she took up the added challenge of leading a Connect Group, along with already heading up our Covenant Mission Partners team (and then going on a mission trip!), so she stepped away from leading the whole Dream Team ministry. She continues to serve as one of the team leaders, however. A big thank you to Jan for her overall leadership, and continued service alongside the other teams. Currently, I (Tom) am overseeing the Dream Team ministry, but would love to empower someone more able than I to take over this important role. Is that you?

The Dream Team hospitality ministry is a vital way we welcome new people, encourage ongoing fellowship, and help the services run smoothly. What's more, this ministry is a great way to include newer people as it is a ministry that provides hands on service and connection with others, in a low threatening environment. We finish the day together as a family with a meal by having a potluck.

The dates for the 2024 "Kid's Sunday" are March 24, June 30, September 29, and December 29 (TBD).

In July 2023 we hosted a very fun Vacation Bible School. Unfortunately we had to cancel the second week in August due to low enrollment, paired with the intense wildfire smoke we were experiencing at the time.

On reflection it was decided that we will not be hosting a Vacation Bible School for the younger kids in 2024. Instead I will be focusing on bringing more family friendly events to ECC that run all year long.

One of the new things I will be implementing this year is a couple of new family friendly fellowship opportunities.

On the first Friday of the month I am starting up a board game night. This event will be family friendly and have games for children as well as adults. This will be open to everyone in our congregation.

The other event I will be bringing back will be the Movie Nights, but with a twist. In talking with parents, I discovered that a Movie Matinee would be better so on the 3rd Saturday of the month we will be starting up our movies again!

It has been a pleasure to lead our children towards God. I feel so blessed to be in charge of leading such a dynamic group of volunteers whose hearts are for Jesus and helping our children grow further and deeper into their faith.

1. Bible Base Camp:

Our Sunday school program for ages 9 and up, Bible Base Camp, has seen remarkable growth throughout the year. The program's success can be attributed to a combination of new members joining and the natural progression of our existing members into this age group. The unique approach of integrating games-based programming with a lesson has continued to resonate with the youth.

Throughout the year, we maintained a dynamic experience by rotating through three different teachers and incorporating a monthly service day where our youth actively participate in assisting the younger age groups. As of now, Bible Base Camp is thriving, providing a solid foundation for spiritual growth.

2. SPARK - JR. Youth Programming:

SPARK, our Junior Youth program, has demonstrated consistent success in 2023. Operating youth-style nights twice a month, we have seen an average attendance of 20 enthusiastic young members. The dedicated team of volunteers has grown over the year, ensuring that the program remains vibrant and engaging. SPARK is currently in a stable state and has the potential for further expansion in the future.

3. Wandering through Creation - Summer Camp Program:

Introduced in 2023, "Wandering through Creation" has been a highlight of our Youth Ministry. This summer camp program aims to take up to six Junior Youth members outdoors, providing them with an opportunity to experience God's creation while being deeply immersed in biblical teachings. We are committed to refining and expanding this program in the coming years, fostering a deeper connection between our youth and the divine through the wonders of the natural world.

Jeff Lockyer's book "Finding our way" is a challenge to see that the church is to be a Holy Spirit-empowered restorative force in our society, in our location, and that this requires three fundamental aspects to our Mission: Inspiration, Connection and Action.

It is the second of these, encouraging meaningful and helping connection amongst ourselves, so that life is better than if we were alone, that was the reason for our emphasis last year on our Connect Groups ministry.

We set up a team to help move this ministry forward, consisting of Pastor Tom, Peter Boot, Carey Morris, Amber Rice and myself (Peter Hambrey). We initially looked at having 6-7 groups last fall, and this settled to 4 that worked well, with encouraging reports from each of them:

Confident Prayers, led by Tom Greentree and Doris Staggs Revelation Within (Women Only) led by Amber Rice and Cheryl Hambrey Following the Steps of Jesus, led by Joe Gunderson and Jan Gobert Learning from Luke, led by Peter Hambrey and Peter Boot

48 people signed up for groups, but not all of those ended up participating. Attendance was 30-40 per week, and then on top of this was the attendance at a few other groups that met but are not officially part of the Connect Group ministry.

Our goal is to slowly increase the number of groups, with the intention that they become as much a part of the experience of ECC as the Sunday worship. That may be more difficult for those of our community who participate on-line, but we welcome suggestions.

Likewise, if you have suggestions for topics that you would like to see covered in our groups in the future, please let us know.
